



# True Learning Levels

## *Instead of Grade Levels*

<b>Beginner</b>	Getting used to his/her body and beginning to communicate. Needs time to connect with his/her world in order to understand the greater context of learning.
<b>Early Learner</b>	Not yet able to read or do arithmetic, but learning sounds, sounding out, beginning writing, counting, numbers and simple addition/subtraction. Content areas with Mom.
<b>Middler</b>	Beginning reader, able to do simple sums/subtraction numeration, etc. Can print fairly well. Content areas with Mom.
<b>Intermediate</b>	Reads pretty well, is learning cursive, is pretty competent with basic math operations but not very far in fractions/decimals/etc. Striking out on his/her own in some content areas.
<b>Advanced</b>	Reads and writes well, learning basic grammar, pre-algebra-algebra or business math, studies independently in content areas.
<b>Very Advanced</b>	Reads and writes extremely well, done with grammar, algebra, studies independently in content areas. Pretty much in charge of own education.
