 - 3. Give a reason for today's lesson.
- **MAINTAIN A PATIENT, POSITIVE ATTITUDE** 1.Allow mistakes.
 - 2.Don't help, let him work it out.
 - 3.Step in only to prevent frustration.



REMEMBER THE TUTORING SANDWICH:

- 1. **Positive**--start with a positive remark.
- 2. **Negative**--relate some constructive criticism.



3. Positive--end on a hopeful note.

END <u>BEFORE</u> FRUSTRATION SETS IN!


SPLIT THINGS UP
